



STRAIGHT TALK CEO Speaks



Dear IRM Team,
Warm Greetings to all.

With the financial year entering its final stretch, March presents a crucial opportunity to consolidate our achievements and close the year on a strong note while positioning ourselves for the opportunities ahead. February saw steady progress across our operations, marked by key initiatives, infrastructure milestones, and network expansions supporting our commitment to clean energy access and operational excellence.

A key strategic development during the month was the signing of a CBG Offtake Tripartite Agreement in Banaskantha GA between IRMEL, GAIL (India) Limited, and Stargreen Biogas, strengthening the green energy ecosystem and promoting sustainable fuel adoption.

Engineering excellence was demonstrated through the successful 8-inch steel pipeline HDD crossing of the Banas River, spanning 828 meters at a depth of 14 meters below the riverbed, the longest HDD executed by IRM Energy, marking a milestone for the Deesa pipeline project.

During the month, IRM Energy also commissioned its first LNG dispensing facility at the LCNG station in the Namakkal and Tiruchirappalli GA, marking our entry into LNG fuel retailing in the region. This milestone strengthens our ability to support long-haul and heavy-duty transport with cleaner fuel alternatives.

Network expansion continued with the commissioning of the 57th, 58th and 59th CNG stations in Banaskantha GA. The inauguration of the 59th station at Jay Babari CNG Station in Nava, Deesa also featured a CNG Vahan Mela attended by nearly a thousand visitors. With these additions, IRM Energy now operates 131 CNG stations across India.

Growth in the PNG segment also remained encouraging. In Fatehgarh Sahib GA, the commissioning of the 100th commercial PNG connection with Zaika-E-Sirhind marked an important milestone. Additionally, a PNG supply MoU with the District Jail at Chappi in Banaskantha GA will enable 106 domestic and 3 commercial connections.

Another meaningful initiative was the inauguration of PNG supply to the Prasad Kitchen of the Shree Somnath Trust in Diu & Gir Somnath GA, supporting prasad preparation for devotees visiting the Somnath Temple.

Safety and operational preparedness continued to remain a key focus. IRM Energy participated in the "Excellence in Operational Safety" conference in Ahmedabad, while the Banaskantha GA team took part in a Level II mock drill conducted by BPCL at the Sidhpur plant. Monthly field safety talks led by department HODs were also initiated across all Gas.

Our work also received encouraging recognition, with the Fatehgarh Sahib GA being honoured with the "Pride of Fatehgarh Sahib Award – 2026" at a ceremony organised by Dainik Jagran, recognising IRM Energy as an emerging name in natural gas distribution in the region.

Beyond operational achievements, our teams actively contributed to community initiatives. Blood donation camps were organised at the Head Office, Banaskantha GA, and Fatehgarh Sahib GA in collaboration with the Indian Red Cross Society and healthcare institutions as a tribute to the 100th Birth Anniversary of Shri Indravadan Modi. A total of 91 employees donated blood, reflecting the compassion and social responsibility that remain central to our values.

The spirit of togetherness was also visible at the HO as colleagues came together to celebrate Holi, strengthening bonds within the IRM family and reinforcing a positive workplace culture.



At the same time, we continue to operate in an evolving global environment. Ongoing geopolitical tensions in the Middle East have introduced volatility in global energy markets, impacting supply chains and pricing dynamics across the industry. While these developments are being closely monitored, IRM Energy Limited remains operationally stable and resilient, supported by prudent planning, diversified sourcing strategies, and disciplined execution. Such developments reinforce the importance of preparedness and adaptability as we navigate an increasingly dynamic energy landscape.

As we move through the final stretch of the financial year, it is essential that we remain focused on achieving our targets with renewed commitment. Finishing the year strong will require consistent execution and collective ownership across teams. At the same time, we must continue preparing for the opportunities that lie ahead as we expand our infrastructure, strengthen our market presence, and contribute meaningfully to India's clean energy transition.
